The Reopening Planning Committee met this afternoon as a follow-up to Premier Doug Ford's announcement yesterday that the province is moving into Step One of the Reopening Strategy.

Step One of the Reopening Strategy begins at 12:01 am on Friday, June 11th, 2021 - the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

As of Friday - these provisions will apply as follows:

INDOOR

The capacity for indoor religious services, rites, and ceremonies including weddings and funerals is limited to 15% capacity of the church.

OUTDOOR

Outdoors religious services, rites, and ceremonies including weddings and funerals are permitted with capacity limited to permit physical distancing of 2 metres.

Outdoor religious services are now permitted by the legislation. These differ from "Drive-in Services" in that people do not have to remain in their vehicles. They may be seated outside (possibly bringing their own chairs) and there is no capacity limit beyond the requirement to maintain 2 meters of social distancing between households. I give permission for such Outdoor Masses and liturgies to take place in the Diocese of Peterborough, adhering to the provincial regulations. This may serve some parishes that were not able to organize drive-in services but are able to manage these logistics. I simply ask that you be sure to maintain the dignity of the Eucharist and ensure the safety and reasonable comfort of those who attend such gatherings. Care should also be taken for the security of any collected monies.

DRIVE-IN

Drive-In religious services continue in accordance with legislation.

DRIVE IN SERVICES

Gathering in motor vehicles for religious service, rite or ceremony

4. (1) This section applies with respect to gatherings for the purposes of a wedding, funeral, religious service, rite or ceremony if the persons attending the gathering, other than those conducting the service, rite or ceremony, do so in a motor vehicle.

(2) Clause 1 (1) (d) does not apply to a person who attends a gathering to which this section applies if the person follows all of the following precautions that apply to the person:

1. Each person attending the gathering, other than the persons conducting the service, rite or ceremony, must remain within a motor vehicle that is designed to be closed to the elements, except,
 - i. where necessary to use a washroom, or
 - ii. as may otherwise be necessary for the purposes of health and safety.
2. The driver of a motor vehicle must ensure that it is positioned at least two metres away from other motor vehicles.
3. A person who ordinarily uses a non-motorized vehicle because of their religious belief and who attends the gathering must remain within their non-motorized vehicle except where necessary to use a washroom or as may otherwise be required for health and safety, and paragraph 2 applies with necessary modifications.

PARISH HALLS

Parish halls remain closed during Step 1.

FUNERALS (Bereavement Authority of Ontario Requirements)

Funeral services and visitations have new restrictions starting on Friday, June 11th:

Indoors – Maximum of 15 percent capacity of a particular room to a maximum of 50 attendees in the entire facility

Outdoors – Two metres physical distancing to a maximum of 50 attendees

The province expects to remain in Step 1 for at least 21 days to evaluate any impacts on key public health and health system indicators. If at the end of the 21 days, the province has vaccinated 70 per cent of adults with one dose and 20 per cent of adults with two doses and there are continued improvements in other key public health and health system indicators, the province will move to Step 2 of the Reopening Plan.

All health precautions remain in force:

- 6 feet or 2 metres of distance between households
- face masks are required indoors
- Hand sanitizers are available at the doors of the church for parishioners to use when they enter and exit the church.
- Contact tracing is recommended in Step 1 for religious services held indoors, and the Diocese and parishes will continue to maintain contact tracing records.
